

## \$2,217,55 RAISED FOR 20TH ANNIVERSARY MILLION DOLLAR LUNCH

**15 August, 2025**: Business leaders, politicians and celebrities joined families touched by children's cancer today to raise **\$2.2 million** for vital treatment and research at The Million Dollar Lunch, increasing on last year's total.

Celebrating its 20th anniversary in support of The Children's Cancer Foundation, Melbourne's prestigious philanthropic event at Crown Palladium raised funds to improve clinical care for young patients and support programs for their families.

Since launching in 2005, The Million Dollar Lunch has raised more than \$31 million for children and their families impacted by cancer. Crown and The Crown Resorts Foundation have proudly supported the event over the past two decades, today pledging a \$100,000 donation, in addition to hosting the fundraiser.

Guests heard from Sheila Patel, the mother of cancer survivor Maya Oldroyd. Now 16, Maya was diagnosed with a stage-four neuroblastoma at age three, Maya's moving story of resilience and survival inspired the room. The lifesaving treatment Maya received through the Children's Cancer Foundation means she has now been cancer-free for 11 years.

The event featured live performances from Lotte Gallagher and Toni Childs, with premium produce, including over 600kg of beef, generously donated through Crown's supplier network.
