

Crown Perth launches Certificate III in Hospitality through Crown College

Western Australian hospitality workers now have another avenue to obtain greater accredited training on the job.

Crown Perth's own Registered Training Organisation, the *Crown College*, has launched the **Certificate III in Hospitality** program for its Food and Beverage (F&B) portfolio.

The course provides Crown Perth F&B team members with a nationally recognised qualification, while they are still able to work.

Already 11 current team members in Crown Perth's F&B team have been enrolled in the 14month course, which will sharpen their skills across a broad range of hospitality skills such as barista, cocktails, service and coaching.

This initiative reflects Crown's continued investment in the **development of WA's hospitality workforce**—supporting local jobs, career pathways, and the broader visitor economy.

As one of Western Australia's largest single site employer, **Crown College nationally contributes to approximately 10% of all Certificate III in Hospitality graduates** through its Gaming, Hospitality and Security intakes.

In Western Australia alone, this translates to a steady pipeline of job-ready professionals entering a key growth industry, with direct benefits to restaurants, hotels, tourism operators, and the state economy at large.

Crown Perth CEO Brian Pereira said offering the course to team members whilst they work at Crown gives them a way to both work and improve their longer-term employment prospects.
