Scores are reported on the response scale of 0 to 100, where 0 means 'strongly disagree' and 100 means 'strongly agree'.

A separate Characteristics Report is provided for each of the scales measured by the LQ.

Scale scores are only computed for respondents who provided valid responses to all but two of the items in each scale.

Results are shown at the organisation level, and then broken down by any training or demographic characteristics that were entered along with survey data.

The Characteristics Report can be used to analyse feedback on each of the targeted scales measured by the LQ. This information is more reliable than results for individual items.

**LQ needs improvement**

A lot of the knowledge that was detailed was fairly irrelevant (spending a lot of time and detail regarding food hygiene, for example). A fair amount of the training was out-of-date and could be interpreted as offensive in some cases (for example, if a colleague or patron were speaking another language to someone else, the training work explained that this was inappropriate and to ask the relevant parties to 'speak English' - this is quite outdated, can put individuals in uncomfortable situations, and is quite racist; Another example was to always refer to an individual WITH a disability instead of a disabled person - this is not the golden standard and varies person-to-person. Consulting with disabled persons shows that many prefer the latter, myself included).
